



The Registration Process for Junior Leaders and Unit Leaders



Junior Leaders are Guides aged 14-17 years working in a leadership role within a younger aged Guide Unit and are financial youth members of their State Guide organisation.

PROCESS:

1. The Guide discusses opportunities for Junior Leadership with their Unit Leader, Region Program Co-ordinator or Region Leader.
2. The Guide visits some different Units to find one they are comfortable in.
3. The Guide registers with the State Junior Leader Co-ordinator using the Junior Leader form, PROG 6.
4. After registration the following will be sent:

To the Junior Leader

- A Girl's Guide to the Junior Leader Program.
- The contact details of Unit/s in her area that may be suitable as a Peer Unit* (if she doesn't nominate a peer Unit).
- Information about the next Fun Leadership for Youth Weekend.

To the Unit Leader

- A Girl's Guide to the Junior Leader Program.
- The contact details of Unit/s in her area that may be suitable as a Peer Unit*.

To the local Peer Unit* Leader/s

- The contact details of the Junior Leader.

The State Junior Leader Co-ordinator...

1. Will be available to provide advice to Junior Leaders, Unit Leaders, Peer Unit Leaders, Region Program Co-ordinators and Region Leaders.
2. Will coordinate an annual resource, training or sharing day for Junior Leaders and Unit Leaders.
3. Will liaise with the Queen's Guide Co-ordinator.
4. Will send the Junior Leader information about Adult Leader Program and Olave Program on her 17 ½ birthday.

* A Peer Unit is a group of girls who are within a few years of the Junior Leader's age. A Peer Unit cannot be the same Unit the Junior Leader is working as a Leader with. Being a member of a Peer Unit is mandatory for the Junior Leader to earn any badges or awards
